

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
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Dear UECF Families and Friends,





Prologue:

" And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing " - Genesis 12:2

God has brought us this far! A fellowship that was started by a few families ten years ago has now grown into a well-known Christian fellowship all over the world! It has been a great blessing for me to serve Him through this fellowship in the capacity of President for half a decade. I thank and praise God for using me as an instrument in the growth of this fellowship. I am honored to present the history of United Evangelical Christian Fellowship as it reached a significant milestone.

1. The Motivation:

In January 1997, a small group of people felt the need for an inter-denominational fellowship that would fulfill the spiritual needs of the lay Christians in the Central New Jersey region. This fellowship would conduct the Sunday worship services without language barriers and maintain the traditions of Indian sub-continent. The intention was to serve the local community and also to bring all the people closer to help the outreach ministries serving the South Asian region.

2. Initiation:

The initial group consisting of the families of Mr. Alfred Bhaskar, Mr Vijay Pulipati, Mr. Rajanikantha Rao, Mr. Ebenezer Mallepalle and Mr. Michael Rose put their burden in prayer for few months. They believed that it was God's will to start a fellowship and they sought the support of Rev. Dr. David Ravinder to serve as an honorary Sr. Pastor and provide the spiritual leadership. With the help of Pastor David Ravinder, the place for Sunday worship service was obtained.

Thus, UECF started its first Sunday service on the 6th April 1997 at the sanctuary of the Community United Methodist Church, located at 301, Chestnut Street, Roselle Park, New Jersey 07204.


3. Incorporation:

An application was submitted in April 1997 to the Dept. of Treasury, Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for Employer status. The IRS sanctioned the application in August 1997 and approved the name United Evangelical Christian Fellowship.

After getting the EIN, an application was filed in September 1997 for New Jersey state recognition and certification of Incorporation as a Nonprofit Organization under federal IRS Code Section 501 (c) (3).



4. Church Location



In the last ten years, UECF has conducted Sunday worship services in three different churches. For the first three years, the worship services were conducted in Community United Methodist Church, Roselle Park. During the fourth year, UECF relocated to the New Beginnings Church of the Nazarene located at 80 Jefferson Blvd, Edison.

However, at the end of the year 2002 there was a need to look out for a new church facility. The Board of trustees met just few days before Christmas and prayerfully decided that New Dover United Methodist Church (NDUMC) in Edison would be a strategic location for the growth of

UECF congregation. Pastor Ravinder and the UECF elders had discussions with Pastor Bob Costello of NDUMC and their Board of trustees on 26th of January 2003 and agreed upon the lease terms.

Thus UECF started worshipping in the sanctuary of New Dover United Methodist Church in Edison from the first Sunday of March 2003.

5. Honorary Pastors:

UECF does not have a regular pastor; however, has an unique arrangement with a team of honorary pastors who bring the word of God on the scheduled Sundays. Rev. Dr. David Ravinder has been serving as the Senior Honorary Pastor ever since the inception. He takes charge of the fourth Sunday, which is designated as Communion Sunday. Rev. Praveen Bunyan served as the first UECF Associate Pastor preaching regularly on three Sundays a week.



Later, Rev. Praveen Bunyan left the UECF and Rev. Sunil Balasundaram who at that time was pursuing doctoral studies in a seminary filled the vacancy. Pastor Balasundaram ministered to UECF as an honorary pastor for four and a half years.

During the fourth year, Rev. Stephen Nash joined as one of the Honorary Pastors and served for almost 5 years. Rev. David Davis came on board as a guest preacher in June 2003 and is presently serving as an honorary Pastor.

In the course of time, the UECF felt the need for a dedicated regular pastor who would nurture and help in the growth of the congregation as a church. A search Committee was formed to examine alternatives and opined that this may not be feasible, considering the UECF financial situation.

6. Elected Leaders:

The first General Body meeting was held on June 4, 1997 for which all the local Christians were invited. In this meeting, a draft Constitution and by-laws prepared by



Mr. Alfred Bhaskar was presented and was approved. The first team of leaders who were elected in this General Body meeting included: President: Mr. Alfred Bhaskar, Secretary: Mr. Rajani Kantha Rao, Treasurer: Mr. Ebenezer Mallepalle, Board of Trustees Members: Mr. Ajit Lakra, Mr. Michael Rose, Mrs. Udaya Pulipati and Mr. Joel Dadepogu. Rev. Dr. David Ravinder was nominated by the general body to be the Honorary Sr. Pastor & Spiritual Advisor.

Mr. Kanthi Paul Rapaka served as Secretary for a brief period when the position was vacant due to a resignation. In the second annual General Body meeting held in August 1999, Mr. Manohar Mudy was elected to the Board of Trustees and Mr. Moses Peram was elected as Vice President.

The third General Body meeting was held in September 2000, and new office bearers were elected as - President: Mr. Ebenezer Mallepalle. Vice president: Mr. Ajay Damarapu, Secretary: Mr. Vijay Pulipati and Treasurer: Mr. Simon Bushi. Members of Board of Trustees: Mr. Ajit Lakra; Mrs. Udaya Pulipati; Mrs. Sujatha Mallepalle; Mr. Carol Daniel. The elected Coordinators included: Music: Mr. Sushil Bhujbhal, Missions & Women's Fellowship: Mrs. Sujatha Mallepalle, Bible Study: Mrs. Udaya Pulipati, Youth Fellowship: Johnsanjay Bhaskar, Young Couples Group: Mrs. Anna Bhujbhal, Sunday School: Mrs. Suneela Damarapu.

During the same year, the President resigned and the Board asked Vice President to take charge. In the General Body meeting held in September 2001, Mr. Ajay Damarapu was elected as President and Mr. Syam Pilli was elected as the new Vice President.

In the General Body meeting held on 23rd June 2002, Mr. Ajay Damarapu announced his resignation. The UECF Board of Trustees met on 27th October 2002 and requested the Vice-President Mr. Syam Pilli to resume the responsibilities of the President.

During the year 2003, the Constitution By-Laws were amended to include Pastorate Committee in addition to the Board of Trustees.

After the tenure of the existing leadership ended, the new leaders were elected for a 3-year term in the General Body meeting held on 22nd February 2004. The following members were unanimously elected: Mr. Syam Pilli (President), Mr. Clement Myla (Vice-president), Mr. Simon Bushi (Secretary) and Mr. Ravindra Saripalli (Treasurer). The elected Board of Trustees are: Mr. Rajanikantha Rao, Mr. Ajit Lakra (Missions/Outreach), Mr. Vinod Nakka, Mr. Paul Moodey, Mr. Sarath Kapudasi; and the Pastorate Committee are: Mr. Phani Pilli, Mr. Alfred Myla, Mr. Sushil Bhujbal, Mr. Chittaranjan Lam. The Coordinators included: Mr. Louis Dundi (Sunday School), Mrs. Susan Bushi (Bible Study), Mr. Sushil Bhujbal (Music), Mr.Thomas Kalyanapu (Stewardship), Mrs. Padma Borugadda (Women's Fellowship) and Mr. Kanthi Paul Rapaka (Married Couples). The new leaders were installed on 7th March 2004.

Singing in regional languages: Praising the Lord with songs and hymns has always been the important part of UECF Sunday Worship Service. Praise songs have been sung in



English and also in different regional languages such as Telugu and Hindi. In addition to the standard instruments like Organ and Piano, many Indian musical instruments such as Harmonium, Tabla and Congo drums were used to bring out special music.

Intercessory Prayers: The intercessory prayer time has been a great opportunity for the congregation to instantaneously share their joys, concerns and needs of the family and friends.

Communion Sunday: Holy Communion has been administered on the fourth Sunday of every month.

9. Sunday School:

Sunday School has been conducted regularly during the Service to both beginners and other age groups (up to 12 years). Sunday School teachers have been following a yearly curriculum in nurturing children with the Word of God. Kids of different age groups exhibited their talents on all possible special occasions. The children enthusiastically participated in the activities such as Sunday school retreats, dramas, skits and group dances. Sunday School children also had the opportunity to visit the orphanages and share their love.

Mr. Louis Dundi and the other Sunday School staff have been dedicated to their work in training the children according to Proverbs 22:6 which reminds "Train up the child in the way he should go, when he is old he will not depart from it".

10. Bible Study:



Group Bible study has been conducted on the second Friday of every month from 8:00 to 9:30 PM. Initially, members used to gather at their homes for group Bible Studies. Later, started gathering at Church premises, as this location is more convenient. Laypersons had a wonderful opportunity to lead the study on all the Books of Old Testament and New Testament. The Bible studies

were also based on the pre-selected topics from the New Testament.

The group Bible studies have been a blessing to many and helped to have in depth understanding of the scriptures. The Bible study coordinators, Mr. Joshua Dadepogu, Mrs. Udaya Pulipati, Mrs. Susan Bushi along with other lay leaders helped in coordinating and conducting Bible study programs.

11. Home Prayer meetings:

Lenten Cottage Prayer meetings: Lenten Cottage prayer meetings were held on Fridays for six weeks during the Lent season. Congregation members always volunteered to open their homes to have Lenten cottage prayer meetings. Honorary pastors, guest preachers and laypeople have lead the lent meditation. Some of the members fast during the lent meditation time and generally these meetings were ended with fellowship meal. Also, members expressed their love by contributing the canned food to the Community food banks during this season.



Praying for the sick: UECF congregation, as one body shared not only the joys and also sorrows of the other members. Families fasted and held prayer meetings whenever someone in the congregation is sick or going for a surgery.

12. Christmas Caroling

It has been a great joy for the congregation to participate in Carol rounds during the Christmas season. Every year, UECF Christmas caroling starts in the first week of December. In the year 2002, with a special initiative, the Carolers visited 36 houses. All the families have graciously welcomed the Carolers and cheerfully offered their contributions. This good start has continued in the following years. God has been faithful in guiding the carolers in the snowy season and protecting them from the chilly winter winds.



Christmas caroling has been a wonderful opportunity both for the adults and kids to actively participate and enjoy the season.

13. Special Festivals & Celebrations



Christmas: UECF has been celebrating Christmas every year on 25th December with gladness and joy. The Christmas gatherings were increasing progressively. Last Christmas (2006) was celebrated in a grand manner. Many families and friends not only from USA but also from Canada and India joined the UECF Worship Service. This was the largest gathering UECF ever had for Christmas, having 250 people in attendance

Christmas celebrations included Holy Communion, spirit filled messages, special music, children's special programs and end with Christmas lunch.

Watch Night Service: In the year 2002, the Pilli families took the initiative to celebrate UECF Watch Night service. 77 people including children gathered at United Methodist Church, Union on 31st night of 2002 to welcome the New Year in God's presence. The

practice continued and it has been a blessing to start every New Year with prayer and Holy Communion.

International Family Church of New Jersey (IFCNJ) congregation joined UECF for celebrating Watch Night Service in the year 2003. The Pastor of IFCNJ, Rev. Ashish Bhatnagar delivered the New Year message. It was a wonderful experience to UECF congregation to celebrate the New Year along with multi ethnic groups.

UECF also supported the Hunger and Humanitarian work in Sudan through UMCOR, supported rehabilitation work and orphaned Children through RZIM's Wellspring ministry and Red Cross.

17. Social & Cultural Events

UECF families actively participated in the following social and cultural events:



India Independence Day parade: In the year 2005, India Independence Day parade was organized for the first time in New Jersey. UECF families took part in this secular event, which was held on 14th August 2005. It was a great experience to hold the UECF banner along with Tricolor flags and marching on Oak Tree



Road. This certainly helped UECF in developing awareness in the neighborhood.



UECF Family Picnics: UECF annual family picnics are generally filled with lots of fun and plenty of food along with the spiritual food. The members with their family and friends enjoyed the picnics organized in famous Parks of New Jersey such as Colonial Park, Johnson Park, Roosevelt Park and Cheese Quake Park.

Adults and the kids alike have taken active part in number of activities and played variety of games. UECF families had the opportunity to enjoy various activities and games such as Bible quizzes, Bibliola (a popular UECF activity), Tug of war, Strawberry catching, Egg throwing,

musical chairs, water balloons for children, dumb charades, Guess picture drawing, Cricket, Tennis and boat riding.

18. Fellowship Hour

The fellowship time has been very helpful in bringing cohesion among the congregation. UECF families have always enjoyed hosting Fellowship Coffee hour after each Sunday service with delicious Indian style home made food while celebrating their birthdays and anniversaries. Members volunteered to sign-up Fellowship Coffee hour roaster, generally placed on the notice board.

All the special occasions like Baby showers, Bridal showers, wedding receptions and thanksgiving service were always followed by fellowship meals.

19. Web site

At the end of the year 2001, Joshua(Phani) Pilli took the initiative to develop a web site (www.uecf.net) for UECF. God has richly blessed this web ministry and UECF is well known all over the world through the web site. Members and others get periodical updates on the fellowship activities through the regular web postings. The pictorial account of the past events were also archived and made available on the web.

Web site has been instrumental for the growth of UECF. It is wonderful to know many visitors have attended the UECF Sunday worship services and testified that they came to know about UECF through the Web site. Some such visitors started attending regularly. Praise the Lord for this wonderful site and the never tiring efforts of Joshua Pilli!

20. Conclusion:

There were some ups and downs in the journey of UECF and it has undergone lot of trials and tribulations with in the last 10 years. But like Church built on the rock, UECF is continuing in faith, moving steadfastly and standing as a testimony to the Lord. As the name suggests, United Evangelical Christian Fellowship is committed to the Evangelism.

GENERATIONAL MARKERS AMONG ASIAN INDIANS AND IMPLICATIONS FOR PASTORAL CARE OF CHILDREN

"Children are a heritage from the Lord." Psalm 127:3

Little children are a great source of joy and blessing. They brighten up our lives with their smiles. Jesus had a special place for little children. Raising the children can be quite a formidable task for any parent.

We often hear terms like, 'Communication Gap', 'Socio-economic Gap' and 'Generation Gap'. We seem to have a general idea as to what these terms mean and imply in everyday living. In this brief article, I wish to highlight one of these terms that is very relevant for our living as immigrants in this country, namely, the 'Generation Gap'. I like to use the term 'Generational Markers' to identify the problematic issues intrinsic to the whole notion of differences in the ages and what these differences might mean and affect our intergenerational living here in the USA. When we use the term 'markers' we are simply being descriptive of what is seen and observed. There are no value judgments made or implied in such a conversation. Problems are viewed as part of life that is dynamic, growing, creative and challenging. Understanding is the key.

Sociologists and Social Scientists have developed a large body of literature around this subject. There is in fact, a 'system' of identifying generational divisions among the immigrant population. These generational divisions are somewhat technical in nature and perhaps need greater elucidation than what I have attempted here. Where deemed necessary, I have offered some examples to illustrate the points.

Let us begin with the term 'The 1.5 Generation'. The term 1.5 generation refers to people who <u>immigrate</u> to a new country before or during their early <u>teens</u>. They are so labeled "because they bring with them characteristics from their home country but continue their assimilation and socialization in the new country. Their identity is thus a combination of new and old culture and tradition."

(Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia, 1.5 generation.)

"Depending on the age of immigration, the community into which they settle, extent of education in their native country, and other factors, 1.5 generation individuals will identify with their countries of origin to varying degrees. However, their identification will be affected by their experiences growing up in the new country. 1.5G individuals are often bilingual and find it easier to be assimilated into the local culture and society than people who immigrated as adults". (Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia, 1.5 generation.)

Many in the 1.5 generation are bi-lingual and bi-cultural, combining both cultures - culture from the country of origin with the culture of the new country. Studies show that cultural assimilation adds to their cultural diversity which in and of itself creates a complexity in such individuals. A majority of the 1.5G within the Asian Indian Christian Community are in their teens and twenties, though quite a few have entered their thirties.

Two of our children were born in India and came to the USA at age five and one and a half. The identification of the five year old with India is greater than the younger child. There are many families who have the 1.5 G children. Sometimes they go through a stressful period of adjustment

to the new culture, especially if they have emigrated in their late teens. Social adjustment and cultural assimilation is more clearly perceived and evident in immigrant children of younger age.

In some families the 1.5G children experience conflict with parents often as children rebel against the traditions of the native culture. Parents are unable to understand this rebellious behavior of their children. In many instances, both the parents work in full time jobs, leaving little quality time to spend with the children, which creates an emotional gap and distance. The author recalls this tension while in graduate school full time, working on a part-time job at night. That kind of a schedule leaves little time for anything else that can adversely affect the children.

In a few families the children became so caught in this tension which made them vulnerable to anxiety and depression. But traditional cultural norms play a part in preventing these children from receiving the psychological intervention in the right time. Delay can only exacerbate the situation for the young person.

There is a collective assumption among many families that mental health problems bring shame on the family and that seeking help is a sign of weakness. There is a great deal of denial. Consequently some of the children in these situations suffer silently with psychological problems by internalizing them and others by acting them out in disruptive behaviors until they get the help they need. Very often these children become the proverbial 'lightning rod' and families get entrapped in the web of over-protection, denials and scapegoating the so-called problem child. Such actions by the parents often lead to further disintegration and disturbance in the child.

In continuation of the social groups along the generational lines, there are the 1.0, 2.0 the 2.5 and 3.0 generations to examine.

In most generational studies, children of immigrant parents are considered to be "second generation or 2.0" if they are born in the United States. The author's third child fits in this category. There is an observable difference between the 1.5 and 2.0 generation children. While the 1.5 G children struggle to deal with two distinct cultures, the 2.0G in many instances is oblivious to this tension. They seem to deal with the same issues from a different vantage point than that of their siblings of the 1.5G. Generally there is a distinct attitude of 'belonging' to the host culture. They do not feel the high level of ownership of the native values espoused by the rest of the family. Individual rights and self-esteem issues are quite prominent to them. They also seem comfortable to question the 'old' values of the previous generation. They are not in compliance with the parental authority that usually resorts to the saying, "You do or do not do because I am your father/mother and I told you so". This type of behavior has 'rebellion' written all over it. If untreated, it has the potential to cause many problems in the family. It has the potential to lead to physical abuse and/or emotional abuse.

Those with one U.S.-born parent and one foreign-born parent (the "2.5 generation") are different from those with no U.S.-born parents (the "2.0 generation") and those with two U.S-born parents (the "third generation"). I do not have much personal experience with the 2.5G and 3.0G and discussion about such is beyond the scope of this article.

IMPLICATIONS FOR PASTORAL CARE OF CHILDREN

Effective Pastoral Care is what most families look for from their pastors/leaders – whether they are clergy or laity. What is at the center of such care is, Shepherding which is a biblical

What does the Shepherd do for the sheep? He provides guidance, in that he leads the sheep, he brings nurture, in that he administers healing remedies when the sheep gets hurt, and he sustains the sheep by steering them out of trouble and harm.

Children, whether they are from the 1.5 G or 2.0 G need guidance and nurture. They need good leadership to show them the way. Effective 'Role Models' are needed in the lives of young children and youth. These mentors need not be only from the family. They can be drawn from the larger community.

Pastoral Care of children must not wait for some crisis to develop before it is offered. It must be an ongoing function of the pastoral ministry of the Church/Fellowship. In many instances, providing regular and effective Care prevents problems from escalating to proportions beyond repair.

Families can also offer a helping hand in this regard by opening their homes for regular gathering of the faith community in small groups for prayer, bible study, and fellowship. Lenten season is an excellent time for 'cottage prayer gatherings'. Families often celebrate special occasions such as birthdays, anniversaries, weddings, house-warming ceremonies, Bridal and Baby Showers, which are happy events that easily lend themselves to thanksgiving. These events are excellent opportunities for effective Care for the family members and friends and neighbors.

I have participated in scores of such happy events that build a true sense of community and foster good relationships. Even in painful and sad situations, good Pastoral Care can be extended. Funerals are prime examples. Deaths of the elderly afford a great opportunity to celebrate their lives and give witness to God's faithfulness. I have witnessed a tremendous opportunity to bridge the generational divisions during family crises. These critical times afford opportunities for families to 'bond' in new ways.

Care of families in untimely deaths of children, miscarriages, still births also have the potential for proper Care of support, guidance and nurture. How these sensitive and critical 'moments' are handled will determine to a large extent the future of these families in terms of stabilizing their faith in a good and faithful God. Immigrant families of Indian origin seem to value such small group gatherings which is a very positive sign.

IMPLICATIONS FOR PASTORAL COUNSELING OF FAMILIES

1. Pre-marital Counseling:

The primary concern in this area is the nearly lack of this type of counseling in the AICC. As a pastor who has served various churches, predominantly White-Anglo-Saxon, I have never had the difficulty in requiring couples intending to get married to commit to a period of no less than six months for pre-marital counseling. Without exception every couple whose marriage I solemnized took the pre-marital counseling course.

To many of these couples, this was an 'eye opening' experience. Almost without exception the opposite is the case when it comes to couples from the AICC. In several instances the expectation was that the pastor simply performs the 'ceremony' because there is no time for indulging in the luxury of weeks or months of pre-marital counseling. This is owing to the fact that the marriage alliance is customarily arranged by the elders of the families concerned.

It appears to be that, among many elders of the families, there is little understanding of what the pre-marital counseling is all about. One parent said to me, "This seems to be a western practice. We don't know much about it."

2. Marital Counseling:

Among the 1.0G the roles of husband and wife appear to be pretty much shaped and set by the cultural values and social upbringing characteristic of the Indian society and culture. This is especially the case in the 'older' couples currently in their 50's and 60's though not restricted to this age group by any means. In many instances their marriages were 'arranged' by the respective families. Typically the husband in this situation plays the 'dominant' role, who calls most of the shots. The wife plays a 'sub-ordinate' role and takes primary responsibility in the care for the children and other members of the family. The husband's career takes precedence over that of the wife's. In families of this type, there is a resistance to marriage counseling, regardless of what might trigger for such a need, i.e. children' behavior, financial stresses, extended family circumstances, etc.

There is apparent denial of anything major that is causing problems to destabilize the family's sense of homeostasis. Outside influences that may suggest anything to the contrary are kept at a distance. Marital and/or family counseling is politely refused. On the other hand, there is some evidence that the younger counterparts of the 1.0G seems to be more open and ready to receive counseling for problems. The author has provided counseling in the form of guidance, support and education on a number of occasions to couples in the areas of listening, communicating, dealing with the past, coping with stress, child rearing, career selection, in-laws, finances, etc.

3. Family Counseling:

Family Counseling takes into account that the 'Family' is a unit and system. It does not undermine the individuals who are part of that system. However, it refuses to focus on any single member of the family as the IP that is, the Identified Patient. Families often try to shift focus from the dysfunction that exists in the whole system within the family to one person, i.e. a child (scapegoat) so that the therapist can then 'fix' the problem child. When a family approached the author for help with dealing with a child who was manifesting aggressive behavior in school, it became very clear that the problems stemmed from the child's home situation, in particular with the child's parents. When invited to seek family counseling, the parents became upset and put an end to the counseling. The couple got divorced at a later time.

Many families view the counseling process with suspicion, and do not easily commit to it. This may be due to excesses and abuses one may have seen or heard from others, or a gross misunderstanding of the counseling process. More information sharing and open dialogue is perhaps the way out of this situation. Also, who the family selects to work with is crucial. Like in any profession, you have good ones and not-so-good ones. Families need to do some background check and look for a counselor who brings good training, skill, commitment and care to the counseling relationship. There needs to be a good deal of trust and confidence in the counseling relationship in order to see positive results.

In closing, I want to emphasize the main point of this article. Generational 'markers' are important keys to unlock the problems faced by immigrant families. Identifying and understanding these traits will go a long way in helping children and youth in particular and families in general. I hope the insights shared here will prove to be helpful in generating more interest in the field for the readers.

FAITH IS THE SUBSTANCE OF THINGS HOPED FOR BUT EVIDENCE OF THINGS NOT SEEN!

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Hebrews 11: 6 (KJV).

We can explain Hebrews 11:1 in this way; If we have what we desire, why do we need to believe for it? We already have it! If we can see the substance of our faith, then it is not faith.

"But without faith *it is* impossible to please *Him*: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is, and *that* He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him" Hebrews 11: 6 (KJV).

We seem to have no problem believing that God is all-powerful, mighty, omnipotent, omniscient, and so on. Faith begins when we believe that God is not only able, but also willing to meet our needs. Our faith is limited by how much we are willing to believe.

The book of Hebrews explains the requirement of a faith that produces results. Remember when God instructed Moses to tell Pharoah that "I AM" sent him. It is a funny name for God, but if you understand what "I AM" means and who "I AM" is, it adds a whole new perspective. Glory to God! "I AM" is the name of Jehovah God that is ever-present. When I say God is my healer, I am saying that the ever- present God, "I AM" is present as a healer in my life.

We can simplify this foundation principle of faith in this way. If you believe that God is your Savior, then He is your Great "I AM" in the area of salvation. If you believe that God is your Provider, then He is your Great "I AM" in the area of provision. If you believe that God is your baptizer then He is your Great "I AM" as far as baptism in the Holy Spirit is concerned. God will be in our lives what we believe Him to be according to His Word.

Jesus tells us same thing in the Gospel of Mark 11:22-24.

"And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God", Mark 11:22 (KJV).

This is the same faith that that defines what God is for you; Healer, Provider, Savior, Baptizer, and so on. If we do not believe that God is our provider, it is meaningless to pray and ask God to solve our financial problems because we fail to meet this first condition. We must first believe in our heart that He is our provider. Once we grasp this, we move on to Verse 23.

"For verily I say unto you, that whosoever shall say unto this mountain, be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith". Mark 11:23 (KJV).

The second step is to speak to the problem and command it to go because we believed in our heart that God is our solution (the Great "I AM"). Once we have the first condition established in our heart, we are sure of God's position in our lives. We are ready to speak to the mountain and receive God's solution for our situation. Jesus tells us that, if we say to the mountain, be removed and cast into the sea, and not doubt in our heart it will be done. The mountain we are addressing here is the problem we want God to solve for us, it could be cancer, debt, or family problems.

The last step is that after you have prayed, you must believe that you have received those things that you've desired before you actually see them.

"Therefore I say unto you, What things so ever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive *them*, and ye shall have *them*", Mark 11:24 (KJV).

There are three aspects Jesus wants us to see in these verses. Firstly, we must have faith in God and what He can do. Secondly, we must speak to the problem, and lastly, we must believe that we have received those things we desired of Him.

This brings us to this interesting issue. How long do we speak before we see the results? This is where faith is not fully understood. To answer this, let us go to Romans 10: 6-10.

"But the righteousness which is of faith speaketh on this wise, Say not in thine heart, Who shall ascend into heaven? (that is, to bring Christ down from above:) Or, Who shall descend into the deep? (that is, to bring up Christ again from the dead.) "But what saith it? The word is nigh thee, even in thy mouth, and in thy heart: that is, the word of faith, which we preach; That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." Rom 10:6-10 (KJV).

Paul tells us that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God. In other words, faith comes when we hear the Word over and over and over. God gave us the same instructions in Joshua 1:8. When we meditate on the word day and night, faith will come and we will make our ways prosperous because we will act according to the wisdom of God.

When does faith come, (that means when logos, or the written word becomes rhema, or the revealed word) it produces results. God created the world with a rhema word. God created humanity with a rhema word. What we need is that rhema word that is activated in our hearts by faith.

This transformation of the Word in our heart depends on the condition of our heart, our attitude, and relationship with the Lord. This is what Deut. 30:11-14 tells us:

"If thou shalt hearken unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to keep His commandments and His statutes which are written in this book of the law, and if thou turn unto the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul. For this commandment which I command thee this day, it is not hidden from thee, neither is it far off. It is not in heaven, that thou shouldest say, Who shall go up for us to heaven, and bring it unto us, that we may hear it, and do it? Neither is it beyond the sea, that thou shouldest say, Who shall go over the sea for us, and bring it unto us, that we may hear it, and do it? But the word is very nigh unto thee, in thy mouth, and in thy heart, that thou mayest do it", Deut. 30:11-14 (KJV).

The Word that changes our life is in our hearts and in our mouths. Life and death is in the power of our tongue. What is in our hearts and in our mouth is what really matters.

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LEVERAGING FIVE LOAVES AND TWO FISHES

[John 6:1-14]

On June 26, 2007, Bill Gates, the world's richest man met Warren Buffett, the second richest person at the New York Public Library to accept over \$30 billion in grants for the philanthropic works of the Bill and Malinda Gates Foundation. It was the largest endowment ever made in the philanthropic history. What is odd about this contribution is that the share of Bill Gates to his own foundation is minimal compared to the largess of Warren Buffett. How did Gates manage to pull this feat? Gates puts into practice a simple business technique, which he has used successfully in growing his Microsoft Empire. It is known as leveraging. It works something like this. You have a smart idea for a business venture; but you have very little money to invest in the venture. Therefore, you go to your friend and dare him to invest in your venture. He knows you through and through and takes you at your word. He invests. Soon, another person invests and another and pretty soon, the whole town invests in your business and the company grows. The knack is that you keep your investment in tact while you use the investments of your friends to grow your business. Venture capitalists use this effectively. Home mortgage loans are a kind of leveraging. You want to buy a million dollar house; but you have little money. Therefore, you arrange a loan from the mortgage bank. You agree to pay off the loan in installments while you get to enjoy living in that house.

We encounter the same technique in this miracle of the feeding of the five thousands. The victuals – five loaves and two fishes were meager, but they were used for maximizing returns in feeding the masses. How was this accomplished? Can this be repeated in our day and age? You see, God is in the business of leveraging from time immemorial. Creation is a way of leveraging. Yes, in Christ we have all the riches of God freely given [Ephesians 2:4-10]. Yet God invites us to share in the great adventure and God graciously accepts our meager investments as though that alone would be enough to make the difference. Leveraging five loaves and two fishes is about the meager investments we could offer in meeting massive human needs.

The miracle about the feeding of the five thousand is the only story that is recorded in all the four gospels. (Read Matthew 14:14-21; Mark 6:34-44; Luke 9:11-17; John 6:1-14). When you study all four passages together, you get a full picture of what actually took place. While the narratives in Matthew, Mark and Luke are somewhat similar, John's gospel speaks about a boy who offered Jesus his lunch of five loaves and two fishes so that Jesus could perform this miracle. In simple terms, the miracle is about sharing resources, organization and management at the right time and place. But the most important thing, it was orchestrated by someone who was in full control of the situation and knew exactly what he was doing. The key to understanding this miracle is found in John 6:6: "Jesus knew what he would do." There is no use entrusting your precious little treasurer to someone who doesn't know how to put that to the best use. Warren Buffett did not give his wealth away to a homeless vagabond on the streets of New York, but to Bill Gates, the most business savvy person on earth. Is not this a comforting thought to know that we can entrust our little treasures and gifts in God's hand and that God can multiply and use

them to bless us and others. Here was Jesus who had worked out all the little details of the miracle and was in full control of the plan and execution of the event.

When we read the narratives in the four gospels, it is clear that the disciples panicked when they realized the growing crisis developing in their midst. The crowds were there for the good part of the day listening to Jesus preach and teach. People become tired and weary. As the afternoon wore off, disciples urged Jesus to dismiss the crowd so that they could go home to eat. However, Jesus told them directly that the people need not depart; instead the disciples should give them to eat [Mat 14:15-16].

You see, when confronted with massive human needs, we tend to dismiss people easily. The excuse we give often is that our ministry is limited to meeting the spiritual needs of the people. When confronted with physical, material and social needs of people, we direct them elsewhere. We tend to compartmentalize human needs into spiritual and physical. Meeting spiritual needs seems easy, but meeting physical needs is a different ball game. It demands a lot from us. All human needs are related. Individual human beings are a unity. Jesus commissioned his disciples to go out, preach, teach, heal the sick and caste out demons. Here Jesus commands the disciples to feed the masses. The mission of the Kingdom of God is holistic in all its dimensions.

One of the things we practice in our congregation is the agape meal. We celebrate Eucharist on first Sundays and we share a fellowship meal following the service. Every family brings a dish to share with others. [I wish we could do this every Sunday]. It is a symbolic way of testifying to our belief in the holistic ministries of the church. Agape meal is not just about meeting a physical need. During our fellowship meals, spontaneous networks of bonding are created between families, men, women, youth, kids and guests. Our services are unhurried and our services and fellowship times lasts for hours. God is never rushed. Jesus did not dismiss people easily. He saw to it that people's needs are met. We have in the USA wayside drive-in chapels and prayer windows. You drive in and press a button. A shutter opens and a person on the other side of the window greets, shares a promise for the day and offers a brief prayer. You press the button again, the shutter closes and you drive off. How convenient! One would think that God has little time for relaxed conversations and fellowship with humans. This is not the picture we get about our Creator God walking with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden in the cool of the afternoon.

How do we leverage our resources for the Kingdom of God? The first thing is to recognize the needs out there. In this case, the disciples became aware of the looming crisis developing in their midst. People were weary and hungry. The disciples sought an easy way out, dismiss the crowd and retire for the day. Jesus would not let that happen. Secondly, we should know the resources we have in our possession and we have to know the limitations of those resources as well. Many of us are oblivious to the resources and talents we have in our possession. Jesus tried to help the disciples to figure out the magnitude of the needs and the resources available to meet those needs. Philip says, "Two hundred silver coins worth of food will not be sufficient to feed the whole crowd." (Probably, this was the amount Judas Iscariot carried in his purse). Of course, Andrew, one of the disciples was finally able to find a boy with five loaves and two fishes. It is always good to know the resources you have on your hand. The boy was willing to share his lunch with Jesus.

Thirdly, there has to be a managed approach to meeting the need. Feeding five thousand men (there might have been equal number of women and children, making a total of eight to ten thousand people) out in a desert is a massive undertaking. Even if you have enough food to feed every one of them, one could imagine the chaos that might have ensued trying to serve the hungry. There would have been a riot in the crowd trying to grab the available food. How was this massive feeding program organized and managed? Jesus had a plan. He said, "Make them sit down by groups of fifties" [Luke 9:14-15]. The moment you breakup the crowd into manageable size, you are on the way to accomplishing a massive undertaking. Each group of fifty would have had an adult supervisor who ensured that every member in his group had sufficient food. No one was left hungry. And look at the venue of this picnic. John 6:10 tells us that there was much grass in that place. How enchantic! You couldn't have asked for a better venue than that. Leveraging requires a strategy — knowing the extent of the need, the resources we have and their limitations, and of course the organization – the appropriate place and time to accomplish the feat.

When all said and done, nothing can be accomplished until we place all that we have in God's hand. Jesus took the five loaves and two fishes, gave thanks to God, broke the bread to be distributed [John 6:11]. Then the miracle took place. Besides, Jesus had plan in place for the leftovers. No food could be wasted. They collected twelve basket of bread (Bible does not record any leftover fish. Obviously fish would have become rotten overnight where as bread would have stayed fresh for three to four days). In other words, every bit of this mass organization had to be preplanned and orchestrated to the minutest details. Nothing was left to chance.

I always wondered about the boy who turned over his brown bag to Jesus. What would have gone through his little brain as he witnessed the miracle unfolding right before his eyes? He sat down next to Jesus. He was totally blown away by what he saw. The key to the understanding of this miracle is found in John 6:6: "Jesus knew what he would do." The person leveraging meager resources for maximum returns ought to be absolutely sure what he is about to do. None can do it better than Jesus who knew exactly what he would do with what the boy had offered him. That is a lesson the little boy and the disciples had to learn that day.

May be you are at that place confronting a dire need or a crisis in your personal, professional and family life. You are at the point of breakdown. What could you do? First thing is to stay calm. Second, come to Jesus. Third, place your resources and the problems at the feet of Jesus. You probably have no clue as to how to handle the situation or how far you can stretch your strength and resources. You are anxious. There is no other way but to turn over those resources and crises over to Jesus. Every problem you confront now can be brought to the feet of Jesus who will turn them to bless you and others. Jesus will even leverage your problems and turn them into an opportunity for blessing and joy.

Introduction

The illustration of Peter walking on water in Matthew 14 – 22:23 is a classic example of risk taking and an exercise of faith that others in his boat had a difficult time following. When reading this event in Matthew, we see that the other eleven disciples did not show the courage to step out of the boat and missed an opportunity to test their faith. There was a huge storm in the sea and the disciples struggled with high winds and waves. During the midst of this storm they saw Jesus walking towards them on water. Peter, as is his want, took the bold decision to get out of his boat and walk on water like Jesus. "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water.", Matt.14:28.

Peter's challenge to test his faith has the following points about faith that we need to look at:

- 1. The Invitation to Faith.
- 2. The Adventure of Faith.
- 3. The Adversaries of Faith.
- 4. The Resource of Faith.
- **1. The Invitation to Faith**, Matt.14:29 (*So He said*, "*Come"*)

Come – is a word of invitation. There are more than 1900 Invitations in the Bible. Consider some of the invitations Jesus has given us in Matt 11:28 ("Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."), Matt 19:14 ("Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven."), John 6:37 (All who come will he receive), John 7:37 (Jesus inviting the thirsty to come and drink). Come to Jesus and trust him as Savior.

2. The Adventure of Faith, Matt. 14:29 ("And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus.")

Peter coming out of his boat is an adventure of faith. He had knowledge of the sea as a fisherman, had experiences with drowning companions, he knew how treacherous the sea could be. His was an extreme act of adventure similar to trying to go over a water fall in a barrel, or mountain climbing, sky diving, car racing, etc., the adventure of stepping out on God's promises, in trusting God instead of man, in giving and not knowing how God will provide, in going and trusting in God to lead the way. Peter walked on water and found out that Jesus is Lord of all!

3. The Adversaries of Faith, Matt 14:30 ("But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink")

Peter's fears were adversaries of his faith. His main fear was not the sea but the wind which was blowing wildly. We need to know what our adversaries are – temptation, fear, grief, etc. Are we struggling with them? Fear and faith are opposites. As faith increases, fear decreases. The more faith you have, the less you have to fear your adversaries.

4. The Resource of Faith,

Matt 14:30 ("he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!")

Peter prayed when all looked hopeless. It was a short intense prayer. A prayer that recognized the power of Jesus to answer! *And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him,* "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" (Matt 14:31). Think about this – Peter failed at walking on water. He began to sink. Jesus told Peter he had little faith because he began thinking about the storm and doubted. But Jesus was right there to pull him up. He'll be there for us, too.

It wasn't being right that made Peter the one Jesus chose to carry on after Him. Peter was wrong much of the time, sometimes in very embarrassing ways. It wasn't his fearlessness. He denied Jesus at a crucial moment. It wasn't his careful, diplomatic use of words, he blurted out some of the most foolish things. What was it? Peter was willing to get out of the boat. Willing to speak. Willing to act. Are we willing? Will we do what He's called us to do? Will we speak when He prompts us? Are we willing to make mistakes trying to follow Him? Let's not be frozen in fear, but instead act in faith.

Jesus is telling us to get out of our boat just like He did when He walked on the water and told his disciples to come to Him. How much faith did those who never got out of the boat have? Get out of the boat. Afraid to talk to your teenager? Get out of the boat. Talk to them anyway. Afraid of what people will think if you lead? Get out of the boat. Lead anyway. Have faith that people will follow. Has God called you to do the impossible? Start! Get out of the boat! He won't leave you stranded. If He's given you the job, He'll give you the tools to get it done. If He hasn't, you'll find out sooner if you get out of the boat. Step out in faith. Refuse to be frozen in fear of failure. So what if you fail. Failure is the stepping stone for success.

Conclusion

Are you also like the other eleven disciples? What is your boat? What are your constraints in life that is preventing you from serving Jesus? Find out what your boat is. Is somebody or something limiting you? Confront your boat. What are your fears? Get out of the boat in your life and step out towards Jesus. Remember there will be storms in your life. But Jesus will pick you up. With Jesus, it is safe to be weak and needy! Sometimes we need to be a fool for Jesus, like Peter was very often, to act, to speak, and to trust Him to lift us up when we begin to sink. Respond to God's invitation to the life of faith! He will receive you and care for you through life's storms.



ప్రారంభ జీవితం!

యేసయ్యను నీ జీవితంలోకి స్వీకరించినప్పుడు నీ జీవితాన్ని సరికొత్త కోణంలో జీవించడం ప్రారంభిస్తావు. నీవు యేసయ్యను కనుగొన్నప్పుడు జీవితం నిన్ను కనుగొంటుంది. 2 కొరింధి 5:17–20 ఎవరైనా కైస్తవుడైనప్పుడు అతని అంతరంగంలో సరికొత్త వ్యక్తి అవుతాడు. రక్షణ అనేది మనం చేసే పనికాదు. నీవు యేసయ్యను స్వీకరించినప్పుడు ఆయన చేసేది. ఏ రకంగానూ నిన్ను నీవు రక్షించుకోలేవు. మునిగి పోతున్న వ్యక్తి తనను తాను ఎలా రక్షించుకోగలడు? ఎవరో ఒకరు అతనికి సహాయం చెయ్యాలి. రక్షించేవాని మీద అతడు పూర్తి నమ్మకం వుంచినప్పుడు అతడు రక్షించబడతాడు. యేసు నీ కోసం చేసిన పని ఇదే! పాపంలో కూరుకుపోయి, సైతాను అధికారం క్రింద వున్న దేవుని తీర్పుకు పాత్రయై నరకానికి వెళ్తున్న జీవితం నుండి నిన్ను విడిపించాడు. దేవుని రాజ్యపు స్థిరమైన నేలమీద నీ పాపాలను అయన నిలబెట్టాడు. పాత మార్గాలనుండి బయటికి తీసుకు వచ్చి, శాశ్వత జీవం నీకు అనుగ్రహించాడు. కొలస్సి 1:13–14" అంధకార రాజ్యంలోనుండి తన ట్రియకుమారుని రాజ్యంలోకి రప్పించాడు."

ఆత్మ సంబంధమైన చెవుల ద్వారా దేవుని మాటలు వినగల సామర్ధ్యం నీకుంది. నీతో మాట్లాడి, సంబంధం కలిగి వుండాలని దేవుడెప్పుడూ ఆశపడుతున్నాడు. ఆయన మాటలు వినగలిగేలా ఆత్మతో ఆయన నిన్ను బ్రుతికించాడు.

న్ని స్వాహ్మార్ ముగ్రామ్లులో విపత్తుకు ఎదురు నిలిచి జయించగలడు. ప్రభువు నందు ఆనందాన్ని అమితంగా అనుభవించగలడు. పరిశుద్ధమైన జీవితం జీవించి, దేవునికి యోగ్యమైన సేవచేసి ప్రభువును మహిమ పర్చగలడు.

విశ్వాసంలో ఎదుగుదల!

నీ నూతన జీవన శైలిలో నడిపింపు కోసం అనుదినం దేవుని వైపు చూస్తున్నప్పుడు ఈ సంగతులు సంభవిస్తాయి. నీవు వాక్యాన్ని చదువుతూ వుండగా దేవుడు తాను వాక్యం ద్వారా మాట్లాడటాన్ని నీవు (గహిస్తావు. కొన్ని సార్లు మనుషులు నిన్ను విడిచిపోవచ్చు. అయితే క్రుంగిపోవద్దు. దేవుడెప్పుడూ ఒకేవిధంగా వున్నాడు. ఆయన సౌశీల్యం పూర్తిగా నమ్మదగినది.

రెండు దారుల నడుమ ఎటు అడుగు వేయాలో తీర్మానించుకోవల్సి వచ్చినప్పుడు ఎప్పుడు కూడా ఉన్నత మార్గాన్ని, శ్రేష్టమైన, పవిత్రమైన అధిక ఫలవంతమైన, నమ్మకమైన మార్గాన్ని ఎంచుకో!

దేవుని గురించి సందేహమేదైనా కలిగితే, బహుశా ఆ దారి నీకు మంచిది కాకపోవచ్చు.

ట్రతిదినం బైబిలు ధ్యానం !

ఎఫెసి 4:32 "నేను నిన్ను క్షమించ గలనుగానీ నీవు చేసిన అపకారాన్ని మర్చిపోలేను" ఇదే చాలా మంది చేస్తున్నపని. క్షమ అనేది వ్రాసిన నిబంధనను రెండుగా చింపి వేయడం. అది పూర్తిగ కనబడకుండా కాల్చి వేయడం.

నిజమైన క్షమాపణ: ఒక వ్యక్తి తన ఆఫీసు పని పూర్తయిన వెంటనే యిల్లు చేరకుండా చాలాసమయం క్లబ్బులో తప్పుతాగి, స్నేహితుల సహాయంతో యిల్లు చేరతాడు. అది వారి పెండ్లిరోజు భార్య గొడవ చేయక, ఆప్యాయంగా భర్తను ఆదరించి పరిచర్య చేసింది. స్నేహితులున్నారని మాత్రమే కాస్తంత మర్యాద పాటించింది. తెల్లవారిన తర్వాత భర్త గతంలో తన ట్రవర్తనకై సిగ్గుపడి, భార్యను క్షమాపణ కోరాడు. "ఇక ఎన్నడూ నిన్ను బాధపెట్టను." అని ట్రమాణం చేసాడు.

ఒక నెల గడిచింది. భార్య ప్రతి సందర్భంలో మన పెండ్లి వార్షికోత్సవం నాడు ఆనందంగా గడపనీయక త్రాగి నిరాశ పెట్టావు. నేను కాబట్టి నిన్ను క్షమించి ఊరుకున్నాను." ఇలా కించపరుస్తూ ఉండేది. ఎన్నోసార్లు యిదే పద్దతిలో విసిగిస్తుంటే, భర్త విసికిపోయి అడిగాడు. "నీవు నన్ను క్షమించావు, మర్చిపోయావని తలంచాను. కానీ యిలా హింసిస్తున్నా వెందుకు?" అన్నాడు.

నేను క్షమించి మర్చిపోయానని నీవు మాత్రం మర్చిపోకూడదు సుమా" అందుకే గుర్తు చేస్తున్నాను" అందట.

క్షమించడమంటే అదికాదు. మానసిక గాయం పూర్తిగా మాని పోవాలి. ఆ బాధకరమైన భావాల ఛాయలు ఉండరాదు. గాయాలు స్వస్థపడాలి. పడమటికి తూర్పెంత దూరమో పాపములకు మనకు అంత ఎడము కలుగజేసిన దేవుడు మనకు క్షమాగుణాన్ని దయచేస్తాడు. "వీరేమి చేస్తున్నారో వీరికి తెలియదు క్షమించ" మన్న ప్రథమ హతసాక్షి స్తెఫను వాక్కులు ధ్యానం చేయాలి.
